COVID-19 Self-Test Kits

COVID-19 self-test kits to use at home (lateral flow tests) are now available from many pharmacies and local libraries. Click here for more information about which libraries offer collection of these self-test kits.

Residents, who do NOT have Covid-19 symptoms, will be able to collect and take away two boxes of seven tests, to undertake regular twice weekly testing at home to help prevent the spread of the virus.

The self-test kits are simple to use and offer quick results.

Social prescriber available at the surgeries

Hazel Throssell has been a Social Prescriber since March 2020. She works for 2.5 days at Little Waltham and Great Notley surgeries and she is usually in the office on Thursdays and Fridays. The rest of the time she supports other surgeries in the same Primary Care Network.

Social prescribers take a holistic nonmedical approach to people's health and well-being dealing with issues like loneliness. The patients most likely to benefit from seeing Hazel are those with multiple and complex needs but all patients can request to speak to her. Hazel is employed by the Primary Care Network, she has links to voluntary sector organisations and groups in the local area and can signpost patients for emotional and practical support.

Hazel covers Great Notley, Little Waltham, Douglas Grove, Sidney House and The Laurels Surgery. Please call Reception and leave a message for Hazel who will then call you back for an informal chat to see if there is any support she can offer.

The option to opt out of national data extraction

At the moment the surgery can share your records to organisations involved in your direct care unless you have chosen to opt out. If you were to do this then it would mean you may not always get the best care available as they would have no access to your medical history.

The national data opt out is different in the fact the information would be used for research and planning purposes. Patients can view or change their national data opt-out choice at any time by using the online service at www.nhs.uk/your-nhs-data-matters or by clicking on "Your Health" in the NHS App, and selecting "Choose if data from your health records is shared for research and planning"
